Ebenezer Scrooge is a rich, greedy, selfish and angry old man. On the 7th anniversary of the death of his partner Jacob Marley on Christmas Eve – Scrooge is visited by 3 Ghosts of Christmas. The encounter with the **Ghost of Christmas Future** represents the final chance for Scrooge to change his ways.

- How did his housekeeper respond initially? How does Scrooge convince her that he's changed?
- What some ways we can express the joy of Christmas and share it with others?

Who Were Mary and Elizabeth?

Mary The Virgin: The Mother Of Our Lord.

- She was of the tribe of Judah and of the lineage of David.
- She was a cousin to Elizabeth, the mother of John the Baptist.
- She was engaged to Joseph of Nazareth; but with child Holy Ghost,
- She became the mother of Jesus Christ, the Saviour of the world.
- As an encouragement to Mary, the Angel was given the news of Elizabeth's miraculous pregnancy.
- Upon meeting Elizabeth, Mary breaks out in a song of praise to God: The Magnificat (Latin: "Magnificat anima mea Dominum" My Soul Magnifies the Lord)

Elizabeth: The Mother of John the Baptist

- The wife of Zechariah, the Priest they were both "righteous and blameless" before the Lord (Luke 1:6).
- The Angel Gabriel appeared and said Elizabeth despite her old age would have a child. (Luke 1:18)
- In the sixth month of her pregnancy, Mary visited her The Holy Spirit told Elizabeth of Mary's condition.
- Elizabeth's and Zechariah's son would grow up to be John the Baptist the prophet who prepared the way of the Lord Jesus.

Mary Visits Elizabeth

39 Now Mary arose in those days and went into the hill country with haste, to a city of Judah,

40 and entered the house of Zacharias and greeted Elizabeth.

41 And it happened, when Elizabeth heard the greeting of Mary, that the babe leaped in her womb; and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit.

42 Then she spoke out with a loud voice and said, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb!

43 But why is this granted to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? 44 For indeed, as soon as the voice of your greeting sounded in my ears, the babe leaped in my womb for joy.

45 Blessed is she who believed, for there will be a fulfillment of those things which were told her from the Lord."


Luke 1:54 – 56 (NKJV)

- 1. In what way would the information given by the Holy Spirit to Elizabeth encourage Mary and strengthen her faith?
 - The confirmation of what God has promised to do in her life.
 - The assurance of God's power to do the impossible.
 - The confidence in God's ability to keep those who belong to Him.
 - The anticipation of God's plans for salvation in Jesus Christ her Son/Savior.

2. How would you compare and contrast Mary (1:34 - 38) and Zechariah's responses (1:18 - 20)?

And Zacharias said to the angel, "How shall I know this? For I am an old man, and my wife is well advanced in years." (Luke 1:18)



When Zechariah questions Gabriel about the possibility of conceiving, the angel makes it clear that he is silenced because he "<u>did not believe</u> <u>my words</u>, which will be fulfilled in their time" (Luke 1:20)

When Mary comes for a visit, Elizabeth greets her saying, "<u>Blessed is she who believed</u> that there would be a fulfillment of what was spoken to her from the Lord" (Luke 1:45).

But behold, you will be mute and not able to speak until the day these things take place, because you did not believe my words which will be fulfilled in their own time. (Luke 1:20)" Then Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I do not know a man?" (Luke 1:34)



Then Mary said, "Behold the maidservant of the Lord! Let it be to me according to your word." And the angel departed from her (Luke 1:38).

- God has given to us (believers in Christ) the privilege of joining Him awesome mission of Reconciling the world through the Gospel of Jesus Christ.





7. What aspects of God does she describe that are different from your usual expectations?


