

Group Discussion:

A Christmas Story

Questions

- How do you think Ralphie felt when he first received his Rifle and then after he used it? Why?
- Describe something you once strongly desired. When you got it, did it fulfill your expectations? Explain why or why not.
- Have you ever encountered people who seem to have everything yet still are unhappy?
- How does the Birth of Christ bring us unexpected Blessings that changes our lives?

Who Were The Wise Men?

Facts About The Wise Men:

- It is a common misconception that the wise men visited Jesus at His birth.
- It was most likely days, months, or possibly even years later – at a house, not at the stable. (Matthew 2:11).
- We know the magi/wise men were from "the East," most likely Persia. (Today's Iran).
- This means the wise men traveled 800 to 900 miles to see the Christ Child.
- The wise men were guided by a miraculous Star to find "King of the Jews" (Matthew 2:2).



The Magi Were Men Who:

- Read And Believed God's Word.
- Diligently Sought Jesus.
- Recognized The Worth Of Christ.
- Humbled Themselves To Worship Jesus.
- Obeyed God Rather Than Man. **They Were Truly Wise Men!**
- **Wise Men Still Seek Jesus!**



Who Was Herod The Great?

Facts About Herod The Great

- He ruled from 37 or 36 BC to 4 BC. He is mentioned in Matthew 2
- When the Magi came to seek King of the Jews. Herod asked them to report back to him "so that I too may go and worship him" (Matthew 2:8).
- The Magi find Jesus and worship Him, and present gifts, but were by God in a dream not to return to Herod.
- When Magi did not report back to him, Herod slaughters all boys up to two years old in Bethlehem. But God tells Joseph to Egypt with Jesus and Mary
- In 4 B.C. Herod the Great died. This news was reported to Joseph by an angel of the Lord in a dream that was safe to return to Jerusalem.

The Legacy Of Herod The Great:

- Herod the Great enlarged and updated the temple on. This renovated structure became known as **Herod's Temple**.
- Upon Herod the Great's death, his sons were appointed rulers in his place (Archelaus, Herod Philip II, Herod Antipas)
- Herod the Great was ruthless ruler whose family followed his footsteps in opposing Christ.

Matthew 2:1- 6 (NKJV)

Wise Men from the East

1 Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem,

2 saying, "Where is He who has been born King of the Jews? For we have seen His star in the East and have come to worship Him."

3 When Herod the king heard this, he was troubled, and all Jerusalem with him.

4 And when he had gathered all the chief priests and scribes of the people together, he inquired of them where the Christ was to be born.

5 So they said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it is written by the prophet:

6 'But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, Are not the least among the rulers of Judah; For out of you shall come a Ruler Who will shepherd My people Israel.' "

Matthew 2:7 – 12 (NKJV)

7 Then Herod, when he had secretly called the wise men, determined from them what time the star appeared.

8 And he sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search carefully for the young Child, and when you have found Him, bring back word to me, that I may come and worship Him also."

9 When they heard the king, they departed; and behold, the star which they had seen in the East went before them, till it came and stood over where the young Child was.

10 When they saw the star, they rejoiced with exceedingly great joy.

11 And when they had come into the house, they saw the young Child with Mary His mother, and fell down and worshiped Him. And when they had opened their treasures, they presented gifts to Him: gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

12 Then, being divinely warned in a dream that they should not return to Herod, they departed for their own country another way.

Matthew 2:13 – 17 (NKJV)

The Flight into Egypt

13 Now when they had departed, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream, saying, "Arise, take the young Child and His mother, flee to Egypt, and stay there until I bring you word; for Herod will seek the young Child to destroy Him."

14 When he arose, he took the young Child and His mother by night and departed for Egypt,

15 and was there until the death of Herod, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the Lord through the prophet, saying, "Out of Egypt I called My Son."

Matthew 2:16 – 18 (NKJV)

Massacre of the Innocents

16 Then Herod, when he saw that he was deceived by the wise men, was exceedingly angry; and he sent forth and put to death all the male children who were in Bethlehem and in all its districts, from two years old and under, according to the time which he had determined from the wise men.

17 Then was fulfilled what was spoken by Jeremiah the prophet, saying:

18 "A voice was heard in Ramah, Lamentation, weeping, and great mourning, Rachel weeping for her children, Refusing to be comforted, Because they are no more."

1. Compare and contrast Jesus the heavenly king and Herod the earthly king in this chapter



Jesus: The Heavenly King

Jesus: The King of kings

- Willing to leave His throne to sacrifice and serve
- He is the Living Word and the fulfilment of the Prophecy of Scripture
- Came to save and give His life for the guilty of sin against God.
- Worthy of Worship and Praise from the lowly to the kings.

Herod: The king of the Jews

- Would not leave his throne to seek or serve the King.
- Rejected the Word and stood in opposition to the Will of God
- Was motivated to steal, kill and destroy innocents to maintain power.
- Wanting to selfishly retain power for earthly gain.

2. Drawing only from the information in this passage, what can we discover about them?

- **Foreigners** – They were Gentiles from the East looking to worship and present gifts the One born “King of the Jews:
- **Financially Well off** – they were able to embark on a long trip to search of the Child and presented expensive gifts (Frankincense, Gold and Myrrh) to Him.
- **Faithful** – They were determined to find the Child – no matter the cost or disappointments
- **Feared God** – Once they received the message in a dream not to return to Herod, they returned “another way” – Fearing God more than King Herod



The Wise Men/Magi


There is not a great deal of info on the Wise Men. What is important to note is that these foreigners are able to find out about his birth and come to celebrate him, thus establishing that Jesus' birth has international significance.

3. How has knowing Jesus involved you in a search or journey that made a change in you— either initially or in your ongoing spiritual life?


Key Facts

- **Priorities** – In search of Jesus, the things that I once thought were so important – now pale in significance...
- **Position** – My search for Jesus has led to have my Spiritual position has changed from Death to new life in Christ .
- **Perspective** – Jesus changed my perspective on personal events in my life and the surrounding world events to a Christian Worldview.
- **Prospects** – Despite what my present looks like I know that my prospects for the eternal future in Christ are bright and a joy to look forward to.
- **Personality** – My daily search for Jesus in Prayer, Scripture and in Church has and is changing me more and more into the image of Him.

4. Compare and contrast the response of the religious leaders (vv. 4-6) to the response of the Magi (vv. 7-12).




The Religious Leaders

The Religious Leaders

- They knew the Prophecy of where the King/Saviour would be.
- Although knowing where Jesus was and there was a search for Him – had no desire to see Him for themselves.
- They had a greater reverence for an evil/earthy king instead of the King of kings.

The Magi

- They were sincere in their search for the King/Messiah.
- Once they were told where the Child would be they immediately set out find Him.
- They rejoiced, saw and worshipped Christ.
- They had more allegiance to Word from the Lord than to King Herod.


Herod The Great

King Herod's Search

- Motivated By Pride, Fear, Anger and Greed.
- False pretense – seeking the King/Jesus with impure motives.
- Not even willing to leave his own throne to find the King.
- Willing to destroy and kill innocents rather than humility and worship.

The Magi's Search

- They were motivated by a desired to worship the King/Messiah.
- They rejoiced when they saw the Star.
- They were sincere in their search to find the King.
- They were willing to sacrifice time, preference and resources to worship the King.



6. The responses of the Magi and Herod are typical of the ways people respond to Jesus today. Describe some different responses to Jesus you have witnessed?

- **Opposition** – Unbelief of who Jesus is and our responsibility we have to Him to deal with our guilt of sin before a Holy God – even to the point of aggressive opposition.
- **Indifference** – hearing the truth about Jesus yet caring more about the things of this world rather than the world to come.
- **Superficiality** – Giving lip-service to the claims of Christ but not having the heart or sincerity to carry it through to end.
- **Faith/Trust** – Hearing the Word of Jesus and believing the message and giving wholehearted devotion and sacrifice to the Lord.



"But these are the ones sown on good ground, those who hear the word, accept it, and bear fruit: some thirtyfold, some sixty, and some a hundred." – Mark 4:20 (NKJV)


Someone once said that "God is obvious by his absence and his silence is the loudest noise in the universe." In this passage God is active in every single thing that happens, but is seldom mentioned.

6. Listen to Christ-exalting Christmas music.
7. Remember the dangers of materialism.
8. Give Christ-centered gifts.
9. Make the highlight of your Christmas serving others.
10. Share Christ with others.
