What Are The Psalms?

THE BOOK OF
PSALMS
12 Kiss the Son, lest he be source from the way, when his wrath is way there are all they that put then the source of the source of God.
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The Psalms are Hebrew songs/poems that deal with diverse subjects with God.

The Book of Psalms is the longest book in the Bible, with 150 individual Psalms.

The Psalms are Divided into 5 Sections/Books.

The Psalms also prophecy about the coming of Jesus, the Messiah.

Overview of Psalm 5

Author: King David, The 2nd King of Israel (writer of 77 of the 150 Psalms)

Date of Writing: Between 1011 - 971 B.C.

Purpose of Writing: The psalm is a prayer, a solemn address to God, at a time when the psalmist was brought into distress by his enemies.


Practical Application:


- In the times of trouble, we can bring all of our problems, trials and struggle to God in prayer.
- God is able to deal with our enemies much better than we can – leave the judgments to Him.
- Our trouble are not from our physical enemies, but from our spiritual ones (sin, the world, the devil).



King David







3. David is confident that God hears his prayer (v. 3). What does David know about God that explains his confidence?
• <u>Relationship Through The Mercy Of God:</u> David knows that by God's Grace and Mercy he is a child of God
• <u>Reliance On The Availability & Ability of God:</u> God has been there in the past and he knows God will be there now.
• <u>Recognition of the Authority of God:</u> He God as the One with all power and authority yet welcomes him as a son.
Note: David writes as a king addressing a much greater King -

realizing he is accepted solely based on God's mercy.








6. How can David's perspective on sin help us to pray for those who oppose us or persecute us because of our faith (v. 10). ?
God's Awareness of Our Enemies Sin: We should realize that God knows it is a spiritual battle rather than physical.
God's Remorsefulness Toward Our Enemies Sin: The Lord regrets our rebellion against Him and desires all to repent
God's Faithfulness to Judge Our Enemies Sin: We pray for our enemies to come to God before it is too late

"But I say to you, love your enemies, bless those who curse you, do good to those who hate you, and pray for those who spitefully use you and persecute you," Matt 5:44 (NKJV)





<u>Keys For Living</u>

- When we face difficulties, we should put our focus on our great God instead of on our problems.
- We can have confidence that our Heavenly Father God is always available to hear us when we pray.
- Because Jesus has made the way for us to have access to the throne, we can pray for ourselves, our loved ones, and even for our enemies.
